Home Medicines Review	900	People currently taking five or more regular medications; or taking more than 12 doses of medication per day; or have had significant changes made to medication treatment regimen in the last three months; or taking medication with a narrow therapeutic index or medications requiring therapeutic monitoring; or experiencing symptoms suggestive of an adverse drug reaction; or displaying sub-optimal response to treatment with medicines; or suspected of non-compliance or inability to manage medication related therapeutic devices; or having difficulty managing their own medicines because of literacy or language difficulties; or having dexterity problems or impaired sight; or confusion/dementia or other cognitive difficulties; or attending a number of different doctors both general practitioners and specialists; and/or recently discharged from a facility / hospital (in the last four weeks).  Can be claimed once every 12 months, except if there has been a significant change in the individual's condition or medication regimen.
Prescribed Medical Practitioner Medication Management Reviews	245, 249 <sup>1</sup>	As above, Item 249 is available to: new residents on admission into a residential aged care facility; and existing residents on an 'as required' basis, where in the opinion of the resident's prescribed medical practitioner, it is required because of a significant change in medical condition or medication regimen.
